The MIMMS course objectives are to:

- understand the definition and classification of major incidents
- describe the nature and management of the major incident response

• learn to deliver the medical support needed at major incidents.

Eligibility

Candidates should be from a medical, nursing, or paramedic background. If you are unsure about your eligibility, please contact the ALSG office to discuss it further.

The MIMMS course is available as a 3 day face to face course or a 2 day face to face course with a pre-course learning element.

Assessment and Certification

Assessment is OSPE based with both written and practical stations. Certification of the course is valid for 4 years which includes continuous access to the VLE during this period.

Re-certification is required after 4 years by 1 of the following 3 options:

- Completing a full MIMMS Course.
- Attending during the testing stations on a course.
- Attending an ALSG approved 1 day re-certification course (where available).

Instructors

Those who perform outstandingly well on an MIMMS course and, in the view of the course faculty, show potential as future instructors, may be offered the opportunity of attending a Generic Instructor Course (GIC).
